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Woe #1: Ephraim & Judah

Disentangling the imagery

- Ephraim = Israel (v.1-13):
 Wreath & flower = pride & glory
 Powerful & strong = Assyria
- v.14: Judah = target audience
 - Scoffers = godless (v.14)
 Covenant with death (v.15)
 - Strange work (v.21)
 - Strange work (v.21)
 - Cornerstone = glimpse of hope (v. 16-19)

Woe #1: Ephraim & Judah

Isaiah's main points:

- 1. God has done this before!
 - Isaiah's track record.
- 2. Don't switch off from realities of life!
 - Escapism
 - Refusing to face reality
- 3. Egypt is a false hope leading only to death!
 - What are our false hopes?

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Woe #2 & #3: Ariel/Judah

•Disentangling the imagery:

- Ariel = Judah
- Key image: Ariel = alter hearth
- Why?

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Woe #2 & #3: Ariel/Judah

Isaiah's main points:

- Empty religious observance brings judgment (v.1, 13)
- 2. Desired Egypt over the LORD.
 How often does God give us over to what we want by way of judgment? (Rom. 1:24,26)
- 3. Woe #3 enters those hiding plans from God
 - Fools
 - LORD's long term plan = redemption (v. 17-24)

Woe #2 & #3: Ariel/Judah

• Be careful what we ask for.

• Beware lest we become lazy in the worship of our Lord Jesus Christ – both inside & outside the church

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
