A starter, or even to keep till the end!

What are benefits & dangers of patriotism towards the country - "kingdom" - you live in?

On Sunday we looked back at the guidance for kings among God's OT people. What priorities in character & behaviour did God expect of a human king?

Deuteronomy 17:14-17

We also looked back at the principles of life, relationships & society God expected. What priorities in character & behaviour did God expect of his people in the OT?

The Lord expected the healing of society's ills

The Lord expected dishonest trading to be outlawed

The Lord expected the weak to be cared for

The Lord expected riches & property to be shared out Deuteronomy 15:1-11

Suggest some others too; prophets like Amos had plenty to add!

 Discuss the meaning of the words Jesus uses like "this world" & "within" & work out your explanation of how we are to think of the "kingdom of God".
- 4 What are the differences between the "Kingdom" life of Christians on Earth, & "God's Kingdom" in its completeness when Jesus returns?

 1 Corinthians 15:24-28
- Our individual lives are made up of loyalties & dynamics in different directions: family, work, use of money, use of leisure, paying taxes, service in the church family, service in the community, public morality issues, what grabs us in the media, & many others.

 As individuals praying "Your Kingdom come!" can we share frankly the particular areas of our personal lives where we feel it a challenge to live the "kingdom life"?
- 6 What are ways in which *our church* seeks to live out the life of God's kingdom? Would you like to put together a 'vision list' of what we should be aiming for?
- 7 Final activity idea to focus on Jesus, our King
 Silently 'speed read' Mark 15:1-32, just counting how many times Jesus is called "King".
 Then, when you agree how many, ask: "How many of these statements were sincere?"
 Share your thoughts worshipfully about the strange way that Jesus revealed himself as our King as we encourage each other to pray with fresh purpose: "Your kingdom come!"
