Who do you think you are?

Ideas for study & discussion. Select which questions you feel most helpful to discuss.

Starter sequence

Ask members what they would include under the heading of "Identity"... suggesting one-word headings or short phrases to say what makes up someone's identity. e.g birth date - achievement - criminal record etc!

Quarter about 5 A4 sheets and ask one person, with a thick pen, to write each suggestion on separate papers which you can spread out in the middle of the group.

- 2 If you heard a competitor in the Invictus Games wounded in war say "I lost my identity", can you suggest what they meant?
- How many of the aspects of identity written on the sheets from 1. are unchangeable, and which of them can be changed if desired?
 On which such issues do we need to do more thinking as a church fellowship?

Read Galatians 3:26-4:7

In these verses there are about 6 different word pictures or images of what coming "into Christ" is like, filling out the meaning of conversion and new life as a Christian. Can you identify these pictures and use them one by one to explain aspects of how the identity of a person changes when they become a Christian?

Read Colossians 3:1-10

5 Here Paul encourages Christians, protecting them from "identity theft"! How does, or should, **our future identity** in the eternal presence of God protect us from identity crisis in our *present* lives?

Read Romans 8:14-17

- 6 The test of the identity of Jesus as our true Saviour was that He suffered for us. How does our identity - of being 'in Christ' - transform our understanding of **trial**, **difficulty**, **opposition and suffering**?
- 7 Have a time of sharing of **changes in each other's lives**. Some may have recent changes and ongoing issues; some may be in changing circumstances right now; some may be apprehensive about changes ahead.

Prayer

Pray over your sharing of change in each other's lives.

Pray for all Christian witness over **Halloween**, especially for hopes for a special time with young people at **NMBC**, and for contacts in the community at **Malden Manor**.

Pray for **students away at university**, especially those in their first term: Jonathan Keeya, Nina Waller, and Dan Trend.

Pray for **Emily Fuller, Erin & Cameron** now experiencing so much that is new in Kolkata, India. Pray for the **leadership** in **this country**, and for leadership in crises across **the world**. Pray for the people at the **Alpha** evening as the **Course** continues week by week.

For a final meditation of worship & gratitude, you could read one of these passages: 2 Corinthians 4:4-10 Ephesians 2:8-9
