Life in the overlap (Romans 8:18-25, p. 1135)



"We don't not want you to be uninformed brothers about the hardships we suffered in the province of Asia. We were under great pressure, far beyond our ability to endure, so that we despaired even of life." **The Apostle Paul, 2 Cor. 1:8**

a. Christians have already been accepted into God's family (vl)

- b. Christians are still waiting for their full redemption (v18-21)
- c. The wait in the 'overlap' is marked by groaning (v22-25)

2. Why life in the overlap is hard

- a. Hardship is caused by the general brokenness of the world
- b. Hardship is caused by the opposition of the world, the flesh, and the devil
 - i. <u>The world (John 15:18-19, p. 1083)</u>

"Anyone who chooses to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God" James 4:4

ii. <u>The flesh</u>

"Dear friends, I urge you, as aliens and strangers in the world, to abstain from sinful desires, which war against your soul" **1 Peter 2:11**

iii. <u>The devil</u>

What has happened to the devil: "Jesus shared in our humanity so that by his death he might destroy him who holds the power of death- that is the devil" Hebrews 2:14

What will happen to the devil: "The devil, who deceived them, was thrown into the lake of burning sulphur"" Revelation 20:10

3. God uses the hardships of the 'overlap' for our good

a. To make us more like Jesus (John 15:1-2, p. 1083)

"If God is allowing you to go through hardship, it's not because he doesn't care. It's because he does."

b. To bring us into closer fellowship with Jesus (1 Peter 4:12-16, p. 1220)

"I have told you these things so that <u>in me</u> you may have peace. <u>In this world</u> you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." John 17:33
