The Story of Life- session 3

<u>The story so far...</u>

1	God made people for LIFE.	Submitting to his rule, Experiencing his blessing, Enjoying his presence
2	People rebelled and chose <mark>death</mark>	Rejecting his rule, experiencing his judgment , Banished from his presence

God's launches his plan to restore the world to life

1. <u>Restoration begins with God's promise</u> (Genesis 12-50)

a. What God promises (Gen. 12:1-5, 13:14-17, p. 13)

- → A Land (12:1, 13:14-15)
- → A people (12:2, 13:16, 15:2-5, 17:4-5)
- → Blessing (12:1-3)

Restoration of Eden: "God blessed them and said 'be fruitful and increase in number" Genesis 1:28

b. How God promises (Gen. 15:8-21, 17:1-8)

... he makes an unconditional **covenant** (= a binding agreement)

c. Abram's model response to God's promise

"Therefore **the promise (about being saved through Jesus) comes by faith so that it may be by grace and may be guaranteed to all Abraham's offspring**- not only to those who are of the law but also to those who are of the faith of Abraham. He is the father of us all" Romans 4:16

→ Blg application for us: God's promises can absolutely be trusted!

2. <u>Restoration is accomplished by God's rescue</u> (Exodus 1-18)

a. The problem- God's people are in slavery (Ex. 1:8-16, p. 58)

Jesus said "I tell you the truth, everyone who sins is a slave to sin." John 8:34

b. The solution- God comes to the rescue (Ex. 3:4-10, 6:2-8)

- → Why? Because of his compassion (Ex. 3:7) Because of his covenant (Ex. 6:5)
- → Who? God raises up Moses for the task
- → How? Plagues of judgement and an act of grace

→ Blg application for us: We can't rescue ourselves, only God can

3. <u>The goal of God's rescue- a small picture of restoration</u>

a. Restored to living under God's rule (Exodus 20-24)

→ God's Law (Deuteronomy 30:15-18)

b. Restored to enjoying God's presence (Exodus 25-40)

→ The Tabernacle and the sacrifices (Exodus 40:34-35)

"The life of a creature is in the blood, and I have given it to you to make atonement for yourselves on the altar; it is the blood that makes atonement for one's life" Leviticus 17:11

- c. Restored to experiencing God's <u>blessing</u> (Deut. 28:1-14)
 - → God's provision and promise

"If you fully obey the LORD your God and carefully follow all his commands that I give you today... all these blessing will come upon you..." **Deut 28:1-2**

But it's not the final restoration yet...

- → Grumbling (Ex. 15-16)
- → Disobedience (Ex. 32-34)
- → Desert wanderings (book of Numbers)
- → The heart problem of **sin** still needs to be dealt with

→ Blg application for us: Enjoy the full restoration we have in Jesus!
