#### **Introduction: One Big Picture**

#### John 5:39-40 (p. 1069)

Jesus is talking to some religious leaders who had misunderstood what the Bible (for them, just the Old Testament) was all about

- Why did they study the Bible?
- What does Jesus say is the purpose of the Old Testament Scriptures?
- So why is v40 so sad and ironic?

## Scene 2: Our rejection of God's life

#### Banished from God's presence

Banished from the Garden- no longer enjoy relationship with God

#### God's curse

We now experience hardship and pain. Death enters the world.

#### **Rejecting God's rule**

God's goodness is doubted and his commands broken. We set ourselves up as 'king'.



## **SCENE 3: God promises to restore LIFE!**

a. God's rescue plan is launched through his promise to Abraham (Gen 12, 15)

#### Read Genesis 12:1-7 (p. 13)

- What promises does God make to Abraham?
- How will the world benefit from these promises?
- How does Abram respond to God?
- Where do we see God's blessings, presence and rule?

b. God is faithful to his promises

→ God grows a great people (Genesis 12- Exodus 1)

→ God provides a great land (Exodus- Joshua)

→ God establishes a great Kingdom (Judges- 1 Kings)

> 2 Samuel 7:12-16 (p. 311)

## 3: God's partial restoration of life



### c. God's people are unfaithful

### 2 Kings 17:7-20 (p. 388)

- Read v7-9: What did the people of Israel do wrong?
- Read v13: How did God warn his people?
- **Read v16-17:** How did Israel take the warning?
- Read v18-20: How did God finally respond?

## 3: God's people still reject God's life



### Banished from God's presence

The people are taken into exile. The temple is destroyed.

#### God's curse

The exile is the justly deserved punishment for the people's rejection of God

#### **Rejecting God's rule**

Israel fail to obey God's law, and instead worship other gods



# SCENE 4: All God's promises fulfilled through Jesus

"No matter how many promises God has made, they are 'yes' in Christ" 2 Corinthians 1:20

- What does he say he is bringing about in v15?
- How do you think this ties in with God's promise to King David back in the OT?

Romans 5:6-8 (p. 1132)

"God so loved the world that **whoever** believes in him shall **not perish** but have **eternal life**"

John 3:16
